Introduction

This collection of Love Letters belonged to Iona Phelps and Harvey S. Gander. They were saved by their daughter Jackie Gander Coon Deets. The first note an invitation to a picnic was written to Iona from Harvey in 1901. The letters were written in 1908 and 1909, while Harvey was living near Cherry Box, Missouri and Iona in Monroe City, Missouri

After Aunt Jackie's death November 26, 2002 they were given to Donald & Elizabeth Gander by Aunt Jackie's daughters Carol Goetken and Robin Coon to preserve and share with family members.

With electronic e-mail this type of hand written letters are a thing of the past. How sad that future generation will not have the joy of reading and preserving hand written letters.

It is with great pleasure that I take this opportunity to compile these letters in book form for everyone to enjoy. The letters are filled with real affection and show how life was 95 years ago. It is my hope that each of you who read these letters will find them as treasures of a past generation.

Iona Hope Branch Phelps and Harvey Smithton Gander were married February 21,1909 in Monroe City, Missouri. Iona brought to this union a son, Herbert Phelps born April 4, 1902. They took a train from Monroe City to Shelby County, Missouri where they began their new life on a 40 acre farm, owned by a free slave, Amanda Henderson. There were two houses connected by a short board walk. Sometime probably in early 1911 they moved to the Perry place a couple of miles from Leonard. In November of 1912 they moved to Happy Hollow, in Marion County, Missouri.

Iona and Harvey had five children, Elsie Maude "Jackie", Harvey Joe, Clifford Robert, Edith Virginia, and Bruce Eldon. Harvey S. died January 4, 1968 and Iona died November 12, 1976. They lived most of their married life in Happy Hollow, Marion County, Missouri, where Harvey built their home in 1918.



I am sending you a picture of someone I don't know who it is. The photographer said it was me but I believe she made a mistake and gave me the wrong pictures. I had them made about three years ago. I would be afraid to send you one of the last ones I had made they't might scare you to death and then we' would all have somewhere to go.





It has been gloomy enough for me cousin Pearl and Ruby Branch came over and helped us to pass away the time. If id I tell you that Mamma and Samil was comeing home the 21.5t if I did I didn't mean to. they didn't get home till the 27th, They had a fine time Mamma was glad to get home but Samil was not he said he guessed he would have to go back and finish his visit when Fairy and I go. I know about how much fun you are haveing Shucking

corn I have had a little experience in the corn field myself. I told Mrs. Ryan how it happened that we didn't get there that sun, and she said she was a little bit dissapointed but, she that maybe some one came to spend the evening with us and kept us from going. I suppose you have your gun loaded ready to hunt

Quail? every body down here is talking about hunting and voteing. I guess you will get this letter about Tuesday and you will have so much to think about you will forget to read it.
